## ... And The World Will Never Be The Same

“The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined.” (Isaiah 9:2)

“Don’t let the light go out,  
it’s lasted for so many years  
Don’t let the light go out,  
let it shine through our love and our tears.”

The words of “Light One Candle” are from an often heard Christmas song recorded by Peter, Paul and Mary. You may need to be a child of the 1960s like me to remember. The song is based on Jewish history, the resistance to Roman oppression by a Maccabean led revolt. They had a light source that would provide light for a day but lasted for eight days. For them, the light was like a miracle showing the presence of God. Jews celebrate Hanukkah in remembrance.

The song, like many others of the time, tapped into the uncertainties of a changing world. It was a call to peace and hope. But in the 1960s, it was a cry of fear, not of faith.

“Don’t let the light go out” seems to be appropriate again. The darkness presses in. Beheadings, ebola, governmental paralysis and growing secularism make it seem like the darkness is gaining ground. “Don’t let the light go out” – fear or faith?

The coming of Jesus was light coming into darkness. The world was dark when He came. He brought God’s light. But, some are wondering, will His light go out?

Christmas is a celebration of the light that Jesus brought into the world. Sin is forgiven. Lives are changed. Hope is forever. Will His light go out or will God do what He promised?

We celebrate Christmas because we know the light that Jesus brought into this world will never go out. The sovereign Lord of all history, who is alpha and omega, sent Jesus to bring the light. The darkness of this world will never overcome His light. **Jesus came ... and the world will never be the same.**

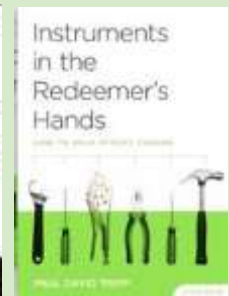
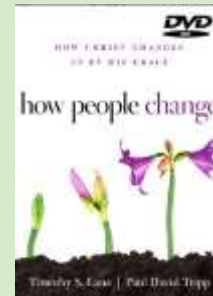

## Reaching Out - Grace BFC Missions and Outreach



### Duane, Joetta, & Amanda Moyer

Duane is the Director of the Bible Fellowship Church Board of Missions. He has 2 main areas of responsibility. The first is to promote interest and strategic involvement among Bible Fellowship Churches in world-wide missions. The second is to care for our 170 missionaries and to be their advocate before their supporting churches as well as before their sending agencies. His day-to-day activities include reading and evaluating reports and letters from our missionaries, responding, advising, encouraging, and challenging them as needed. When missionaries are in the area on furlough, he meets with them in person. He writes weekly articles for Friday Prayer, and he provides direction, encourages, and oversees the work of his staff. On weekends, he speaks in churches and meets potential missionary candidates and supporters. Duane also advises Elder Boards who are interviewing potential missionaries, and he makes sure they receive timely news from their envoys as it becomes available to him.

Joetta has found many ways to serve through the ministries of Grace Bible Fellowship Church in Quakertown. She helps teach the weekly Women's Bible Study. She is one of the leaders of a newly formed group for young mothers, and she serves in Awana. God has blessed them with a house of their own a half-mile from Duane's parents' home in Perkasie, and Joetta visits them several times a week and helps with housework. She also takes their daughter, Amanda, to and from Bucks County Community College.

Amanda just started college this year and is considering a major in Accounting. Justin, their oldest son, is a chemical engineer at Merck in West Point. He and his wife Sara have a son, Tristan, Duane and Joetta's first grandchild, born in March 2014. Caleb, their second son, lives in Harrisburg and works as a design engineer at TE connectivity while going to school at Penn State.

**In Duane's words,** "God has blessed us through this change in life and ministry. We realize that He was preparing us for this and putting everything in place long before we knew what was coming. I am very grateful for the opportunity to invest what we learned through 35 years of service in Guadeloupe into the lives of missionaries who are on the field right now."

- 3.) "Pray that the Lord will use the letters and articles I write to encourage and build up both the missionary family and the supporters."
- 4.) "Pray for wisdom in guiding potential new missionaries through the process of discerning the Lord's leading and acquiring the necessary qualifications and support to pursue His call."
