

Projects for the Week

Compassion Corp works with an woman in Liberia named Martha who has taken orphan children into her home and cares for their needs, 64 of them to be exact. A lot of these kids lost there parents in the civil war that ended not long ago in that country. We are going to help support in a number of ways this week.

1. We are raising money for a chicken coop for the orphans and buying them some chickens to go in it.
2. We will be tie dying pillow cases for each of the 64 kids that Martha takes care of.
3. There facility does not have very many decorations so our kids will be decorating quilt squares that will be sent over to Liberia then the kids there will tie the quilt together and hang it as decoration in their house.
4. We are also writing letters to Martha's kids and sending over to them a scrapbook of our week at camp.

In the Village Room

Tonight the children had the chance to taste some African Rice Bread. Here is the recipe if you would like to try it at home.

African Rice Bread Recipe

- 7-8 large ripe bananas
- 1 box cream of rice
- 1 cup cooking oil
- 1 Tbs butter
- 1 egg
- 2 tsp baking soda
- 3/4 cup of sugar
- 3/4 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp ground ginger
- 1 cup of water.

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour one 13x9 inch baking pan
Peel the bananas and mash them in a mixing bowl using a potato masher or a fork. Add the egg, sugar, and oil to bowl. Beat for one minute with mixer at low speed.
Add the cream of rice, butter, baking soda, salt, ginger and water to the mixture. Beat on high speed three minutes or until well mixed.
Pour into pan. Bake 50-55 minutes. It is done when it leaves the sides of the pan.
